ISHN2022 in Rome

The **26**th annual meeting of our International Society for the History of the Neurosciences (ISHN) took place on the campus of Sapienza University in Rome, Italy from **14-18** June **2022** (http://www.ishn.org/ishn2022-final-program.pdf).

Organization

The organizers of the meeting, chaired by Elisabetta Sirgiovanni (Sapienza University), faced and overcame a number of challenges. This was our first meeting as the COVID pandemic was releasing its grip. Many members were hesitant to participate in the meeting in the traditional "in-person" format. Dr. Sirgiovanni and her wonderful team—including Gabriella Antonucci, Alessandro Aruta, Livia Castelli, Marco Cilione, Maria Conforti, Denise Corridore, Gilberto Corbellini, Stefano Ferracuti, Valentina Gazzaniga, Silvia Iorio, Paolo Mazzarello, Livia Ottolenghi, Francesca Ripari, Anastasia Sonego, Klorinda Caushllari, Anastasia Sonego, Alessia Tirnetta, Federica D'Annunzio, Roberta Giorgi, Valentina Marchionni, Aurora Odierno and other members—did a terrific job in making sure that the "hybrid" meeting, in which both local and distant audiences could appreciate and discuss presentations from Rome or anywhere else in the world, was a success. In addition, from a financial perspective, Elisabetta Sirgiovanni was able to end up with a surplus, which is also a great accomplishment.

Papers and Symposia

Representatives from 10 countries put forward more than four dozen works on various aspects of the history of the neurosciences including materials dedicated

to studies of neuroanatomy, neurosurgery, memory, vision, movement, and the autonomic nervous system, followed by sessions on epilepsy, neurodegenerative disorders, insomnia, social and cultural themes, and more.

Paolo Mazzarello (University of Pavia) gave an invited lecture, From Basic Research to Practical Applications: The Golgi School and Peripheral Nerve Regeneration. Special symposia were organized by Marco Piccolino (University of Ferrara) and Nicholas Wade (University of Dundee) on Dante and the Neurosciences, and by Francesco Brigo and Lorenzo Lorusso (Società Italiana di Neurologia, SIN-GSN) on The Historical Contribution of Italy to Neuroanatomy and Neurological Examination. The latter took place near Vatican City in a magnificent auditorium at Santo Spirito Hospital, which was founded somewhere between 1198 and 1201 by the Roman pontiff Innocent III; it is the oldest hospital in the city that still operates. In addition, Elisabetta Sirgiovanni chaired a symposium on Electro-Convulsive Therapy at Sapienza, which was held at the beautiful Botanical Gardens at Trastevere, where the participants also could enjoy a guided tour.

Tours

The participants had the benefit to tour museums of Sapienza University including Museum and Library of the History of Medicine, Museum of Comparative Anatomy, Museum of Pathological Anatomy, and Museum of Earth Sciences.
