

DO YOU HAVE OBSESSIVE-COMPULSIVE DISORDER?

The UCLA OCD Research Program is looking for individuals with OCD to participate in a research study with the following benefits:

- Free diagnostic evaluation
- Free magnetic resonance brain imaging
- \$150 compensation, plus a performance-based bonus of up to \$50

- Do you have **thoughts or fears** that don't make sense but still make you feel bad?
- Do you have to **check or do things over and over again**?
- Do you **wash excessively or avoid touching things** for fear of contamination?

You may be eligible if you:

- Are 18-65 years of age
- Are in good physical health
- Have no history of **certain** other psychiatric illnesses

The purpose of this study is to look at what happens in the brain when people with OCD pick choices during two simple decision-making tasks on a computer screen. We will use a non-invasive method called **transcranial magnetic stimulation (TMS)**, which involves passage of a small, safe and well-tolerated electrical current to see how it affects the way research participants decide and select choices. **This is not a treatment study.**
